"He [Jesus] died so he could give the church to himself like a bride in all her beauty. He died so that the church could be pure and without fault, with no evil or sin or any other wrong thing in it" (Ephesians 5:27).

Ponder that verse. Jesus died for a bride.

The letter to the Ephesians celebrates the beauty of the church—the Bride of Christ. From our perspective the church isn't so pretty... But heaven sees more. Heaven sees the church as cleansed and made holy by Christ. (Lucado, M., 1998).

1. Working in pairs read a chapter of Ephesians, then summarize the chapter in one sentence. Just for fun, link the chapter you're looking at to a song (secular or sacred).

List anything in this chapter that remains unclear or new for you.

Make a note of a takeaway for you from this chapter.

2. Have a flick through your bible at Ephesians. List the main themes that you see appearing.

3. Paul uses the word 'walk' at least seven times, with the first reference in 2:2 What is he talking about? See 2:10; 4:1; 4:17; 5:2; 5:8

Background

- 1. the Ephesian church was founded by Paul but the epistle was written around 62ad while Paul was a prisoner; he is 'an ambassador in chains' (6:20).
- 2. After spending eighteen months in Corinth (Acts 18:11), he visited Ephesus with Aquila and Priscilla (Acts 18:18,19).
- 3. Paul stayed there for only a short time but promised to return (Acts 18:19-21)
- 4. Aquila and Priscilla remained in Ephesus where God led them to instruct a powerful Bible preacher named Apollos in the details of the Word of God (Acts 18:24-26)
- 5. Paul returned during his third missionary trip and stayed three years (19:8-10; 20:31)
- 6. His stay in Ephesus is marked by several noteworthy events
 - a. Paul baptised a dozen of John the Baptist's followers Acts 19:1-7
 - b. Unusual miracles occurred (19:11,12) "Now God worked unusual miracles by the hands of Paul, so that even handkerchiefs or aprons were brought from his body to the sick, and the diseases left them and the evil spirits went out of them."
 - c. Strange events took place (19:13-16)
 - d. sorcerers were converted (19:17-20) "Also, many of those who had practiced magic brought their books together and burned them in the sight of all. And they counted up the value of them, and it totalled fifty thousand pieces of silver [drachma = days wage]."
 - e. The city rioted over silversmith Demetrius' loss of business because of people who turned to Christ from worshipping the great Ephesian goddess Artemis (19:24-41)
